## RESOLUTION EL PASO COUNTY TRANSIT TITLE VI PLAN

El Paso County, Texas through its transit program and contractors operates and provides the local public with transit services. To facilitate these services, El Paso County receives federal grant funds and keeps compliant with federal requirements such as submission of a Title VI Plan every three years.

WHEREAS, El Paso County Transit provides services and programs that are made available to the public via fixed routes in the towns of Anthony and Clint, the Village of Vinton, the cities of Socorro and Horizon and the unincorporated areas of Westway, Canutillo, Montana Vista, Agua Dulce, Sparks, Fabens and Tornillo. These routes head to and from the City of El Paso;

WHEREAS, El Paso County Transit notifies the public of their rights under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and makes complaint forms and procedures available to the public;

WHEREAS, El Paso County Transit promotes inclusive public participation by holding public meetings, implementing public engagement strategies, using media and any resources available to gain public involvement;

WHEREAS, El Paso County Transit provides language assistance by developing the Language English Proficiency Plan that offers language assistance to persons with limited English proficiency who wish to access the transit services:

WHEREAS, El Paso County Transit, as a recipient of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grant dollars, complies with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d), US Department of Transportation implementing regulations, FTA Circular 4702.1B, and TxDOT-PTN requirements, as specified in Master Grant Agreement and State Management Plan;
